MISSION

SHCJ Associates of the United States are women and men rooted in the charism of Cornelia Connelly who want to grow in her spirit. The Associates strive to bear witness to a life grounded in the Incarnation. Associates are called to help others believe that God lives and acts in them and to rejoice in God's presence in our midst.

VISION

One in Spirit, Holy Child Associates collaborate with the Society of the Holy Child Jesus to embody the charism of Cornelia Connelly in our everyday lives while responding to the wants of the age with generosity.

CHARISM

Holy Child Associates embrace the charism of Cornelia Connelly – a charism grounded in the gospel message of the Word Made Flesh and centered in the mystery of God's life and presence in the lives of women, men and all of creation.

What does it mean to be an Associate of the Society of the Holy Child Jesus?

An Associate is invited, first and foremost, to a way of life; to a way of being that influences everything we do.

The Holy Child Jesus leads us "from the crib to the cross" and beyond, to the fullness of resurrected life. Associates are guided by Christ, the Incarnation of God, and the foundational insights of Cornelia Connelly, founder of the Society of the Holy Child Jesus.

We share Cornelia Connelly's spirituality, grounded in the Incarnation: God's merciful love, embodied in the humble and hidden life of the Holy Child Jesus, reveals the presence and action of God in everyone and everything.

We adopt a way of life that reflects the Holy Child mission: "To help others believe that God lives and acts in them and in our world and to rejoice in God's presence." We make the Society's mission our own, responding to God's love with joy and zeal in daily life and in "meeting the wants of the age" especially among the humble and hidden of our world.

We are supported by participation in the four pillars of Association:

• Personal Prayer

By prayer, reflection, and personal connection with God, we become hearers/discerners of God's presence and action in ourselves and in the world.

• Spiritual Development

Together with the Sisters and Associates, we engage in a lifelong process of growth in Christ, in the spirit of the Society - for example, through communal prayer, retreats and reflection material.

Ministry

Prayer and spiritual growth lead to "actions, not words," to loving service within the family, at work, in the local or global community and/or in SHCJ ministries and initiatives. Associates support each other in the joys and challenges of discipleship.

Community

We gather in fellowship with Sisters and Associates for prayer, social activity and significant events, bonding us to each other through the spirit of the Holy Child.
